<p>Research applied – Evidence of research facts and/or statistics</p>	<p>Minimal collection of research facts, trends or topic vocabulary (Generalizations rather than specifics)</p> <p>1 2 3</p>	<p>Limited research showing knowledge of topic; more research possible</p> <p>4 5 6</p>	<p>Research noticeable in facts which relate to current challenges and solutions to topic</p> <p>7 8</p>	<p>Research apparent in majority of facts / statistics which relate to topic</p> <p>9 10</p>
